

Crescent Homes Reaches Nearly \$200,000 in Charleston Donations

Charleston, SC - Since its inception in April 2017, the Crescent Homes GIVE program has donated \$199,000 to 44 local Charleston charities. The private homebuilder's philanthropic program donates \$250 to a local group for every home sold, allowing new home buyers to choose from five different foundations every quarter. Q2 of 2019 saw \$23,500 in donations.

For over two years, Crescent Homes has supported local charities throughout the Charleston area, and has since expanded the GIVE program to its two other markets in Nashville, TN and Greenville, SC.

The following local nonprofits received donations in the 2nd quarter:

- \$6,000 to Camp Rise Above
- \$4,250 to Charleston Hope
- \$3,750 to Louie's Kids
- \$4,500 to Project Alive and Kicking
- \$5,000 to Valiant Animal Rescue

The GIVE program allows us to support a wide variety of worthy causes while involving our home buyers in the process as a way to spread awareness and facilitate new relationships between residents and local nonprofits.

The following nonprofits have been selected to receive donations from Crescent Homes in Q3:

Sea Turtle Care Center

Located within the South Carolina Aquarium, the Sea Turtle Care Center relies on staff, volunteers, and donors to rescue, rehabilitate, and release sick and injured sea turtles. For 17 years, their Sea Turtle Hospital has cared for dozens of rescued sea turtles, while the Zucker Family Sea Turtle Recovery now opens the doors to the public, educating visitors and children on the importance of prevention and the rehabilitation process.

Charleston Library Friends

Charleston Library Friends is a local nonprofit supporting Charleston's network of libraries through book sales, special events, and library advocacy. The group allocates funds to support library programs, engages the community by promoting library initiatives, and advocates for the libraries at both a local and state level.

Cystic Fibrosis Foundation

The Charleston chapter of the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation works toward a cure of Cystic Fibrosis through fundraising events, including the group's largest event Great Strides. In addition to financially supporting drug research, the foundation advocates on behalf of the CF community.

Tri-County Veterans Support Network

The Tri-County Veterans Support partners with local veteran agencies to support veterans and their families. Together, the groups provide emergency relief, housing, employment, education, and spiritual support to veterans in need.

Teal Diva

Teal Diva was originally founded by ovarian cancer survivor Shannon Routh as a way to connect with a community she could relate to after her recovery. It has since expanded upon this initial mission to educate the community and support diagnostic research for ovarian and other gynecologic cancers, while continuing to empower and support women throughout their journey.

At the end of each quarter, the Crescent Homes team presents the full donation to each nonprofit, meeting those involved and thanking them for their continued support of the Charleston community.

Having the opportunity to meet the people behind such incredible causes allows the Crescent team to become more informed and connected to the groups we support. Any relationship we

can create strengthens the Charleston community, and it is our intention to continue forging these connections among our team, our buyers and local nonprofits.
